Tamiya Spray Work Painting Stand Review

Tamiya has released a multipurpose paint stand that has two turntable style bases in the kit. The first is an adjustable wire tension stand that is perfect for 1/20th through 1/43rd scale cars. The second stand comes with 4 wire clamps that can be inserted into one of the many slots around the outer edge of the stand. There are also several holes in the middle so one could use dowel sticks with clips attached or use the sprue itself.

Upon opening the box my first reaction was, Wow, is this lightweight and spins too freely. I adjusted the multi-position wires to what looked like a good width and attached a Tamiya 1/24th scale Volkswagen bug body to the stand. It held the body very well. I also pulled out some 1/43rd and 1/20th scale bodies. All were securely held by the paint stand after adjusting the wires. My next test was to prove my original thought that the stand was too light. I used

Testors new Lacquer spray and shot primer and color onto the Volkswagen body. To my surprise the stand did not twirl like a pinwheel. I then pulled out my airbrush and raised the air pressure to 30 psi and got the body to spin by shooting directly on a corner of the body. I do not believe this would be a problem in a real painting situation. However you could simply drill a small hole in the base and put a small nail in the hole to stop the spinning if it did become a problem.

In the painting process I ran into two situations that are of some concern but easily fixed. The first problem is the paint stand base is too close to the unit that holds the body. It is very hard to paint up inside of the body. The fix, add a dowel or plastic tube between the base and head unit to give more room between the two parts. The second problem arose when the head unit fell off of the stands base as I was holding it almost upside down and painting the clear on the lower body panels. Make sure you have pressed the head unit on the base securely, I did not. I will be adding a small screw to make sure that never happens again.

The second base is pretty straight forward it holds items by clips or on the sprue. I experienced no problems while painting some small parts while attached to the paint stand.

The big question, is it worth the \$20.00? I wish it were a little heavier and had more height.

I think the tension wire head is a great design. I like the fact it holds several scales with no problems at all. It is better than the coat hanger or wire configurations I have used before.

So I think if you build multiple scales it is worth the money. (I also like gadgets) To some it may seem like a waste of \$20.00 so the decision is do you need a paint stand? If so, I suggest this one with the two small modifications stated above.

Formula Canada Resin Riley & Scott MkIIIc Kit

There are not a lot of kits representing ALMS proto-type racers. The recently released Formula Canada Riley & Scott MKIII is one of the few if not the only one available. I purchased the kit so here's a review......

The resin body is well molded with well defined panel lines, straight louvers and open cooling ducts. Separate body parts included are four front winglets, rear wings and wing support molded in resin. I haven't been able to find many pictures of the real car so I cannot comment on the accuracy of the body but it does look good.

Two photo etch sheets are included with a Gurney strip, tail lights and various screens on one sheet, wing end plates, cockpit diffuser, exhaust flaps, tow hook, rear wing clips, kill switch and body clips on the other.

A separate piece of styrene sheet is provided for the side skirts and mirror supports. The mirrors are also molded in resin.

The chassis plate has the interior compartment, textured seat lower and rear diffusers molded in. The separate exhaust pipes are resin.

The resin interior parts include the top half of the seat, dash panels, steering wheel, various cockpit boxes, shift lever, fire bottle and roll hoop parts. A full photo-etch racing harness is provided on a separate photo etch sheet.

The multi-spoked wheels are two piece moldings with separate disc brake/calipers molded in resin. The discs are installed between the open spokes and solid wheel backs. The tires are a black rubber like material.

The well printed decals include all the sponsor markings, yellow Goodyear Eagle lettering for the tires and rivet detail for the access panels. A separate sheet includes a large set of Norcold decals for the airbox.

The windscreen and headlight covers are molded in a clear vacu-formed piece.



The two page instruction sheet includes numerous colour photos of the completed model for decal placement on one side and decal, p/e parts identification and building suggestions on the other.

Formula Canada has done it again. The kit is well done with crisp moldings, well defined photo- etch and a lot of small extras needed to build a nice replica.

A must have for any ALMS/IMSA fan.

Editors note: this is the later version of the R&S, from the 2001 season as run by the Dyson team, drivers were Bitch Leitzinger and James Weaver. Formula Canada previously did the earlier R&S, the Dyson team cars from the 1995 and 1996 seasons. Retail cost is about is about \$100, available from the usual resin kit sources including www.islandcollectibles.com, which is where I obtained the photos above.
