There was a recent internet story stating that Revell has canceled some die-cast and metal body kits to focus attention on new plastic model kits due to customer requests. If this is true it would be good news to plastic kit builders like GTR.

Another internet rumor is of a transikit to replace the decals provided as headlights on the Revell Greenwood Corvette racer kit.

Real World

After several years of being dominated by open cockpit prototypes, it looks like the next big trend in sports car racing is back to the Grand Touring cars. In the GTS category, Aston Martin has made some big news recently with the announcement of their **DBR9** racer.



They plan to build 32 of these, for factory and privateer teams. The Maserati C12 has also been approved for LeMans and ALMS competition, along with the new C6 Corvettes and the Lamborghini Murcielago and rumored interest by other manufacturers (BMW and Porsche) this may be the future of sports car racing.

Chevy has announced they are pulling out of the IRL open wheel series. And there are rumors that Toyota will also be gone soon to attack NASCAR Nextel Cup in 2007. Add the uncertainty about Cosworth and the future holds a lot of concern for US open wheel

racing. Maybe Champ Car and IRL will eventually be forced to join after all due to lack of equipment?

More dropouts – Citroen and Peugeot will both end their factory team's participation in the World Rally Championship after 2005. These were great looking and highly technical race cars, and were the subject of many model kits by Tamiya, Hasegawa, Heller and others. So far only Ford and Subaru are left in the WRC for 2006.

(NATIONAL HOBBY SHOW) REPORT

Well you can call the iHobby Expo at the Expo Center in Rosemont last month (formerly RCHTA) the National Hobby Show, but if you really want to know, this was the SMALLEST hobby show here in Chicago in years. I don't know if it's the state of the hobby or, after talking to people there, political infighting among the show's organizers and the "bad guys" in Las Vegas, Hobby Visions. What I do know, is that they both shot themselves in the foot. The line was drawn, and split the industry right down the middle. Thanks to that, there will be NO hobby show in Chicago next year. It's moving to Los Angeles. This has gotten WAY out of hand, and I for one, will find it difficult going to "LA LA" land to see what's new next year. You don't alienate your core retailers by moving the show out of town. That is EXACTLY what is happening, and mark my words, this will be a dismal mistake. The Midwest is the CORE of the hobby business. Count the number of hobby manufacturers in the Midwest. See what I mean? But, what do I know? What I do see, however, is the Chinese invasion of the hobby, and the number of Chinese backed companies with offices in California. That's nice for receiving containers but not really nice for entertaining clients. The US needs shows on three fronts. The West Coast, the Midwest, and the East Coast, and always will. Anyway, I'll get off my soapbox now and talk about what's new!

What I did see as far as plastic models go is pretty lame. Guys, I really thought that we were in for some really knock out stuff, but I was pretty disappointed. If you are a race car modeler, the basis of this club, there wasn't much to see. BUT, there were a few surprises that are worth mentioning, most notably Tamiya's Nizmo Nissan 350Z race car. Check out this month's Automobile magazine with a big article about Japanese Touring car racing. It's great. Now we need a new Raybrig Acura and a Nissan Skyline and that would be a good start. Revell/Monogram announced a few "new" race cars, like the 1966 Penske Corvette, but as of yet has no licensing for it (UUFGH!) here we go again! In the meantime, we get more NASCAR kits, a repop of the Mustang GT350R (which by the way, there are some new decal

sheets to make the only LeMans entry of this car) AND we get a new 2005 Mustang. I hope they wait for the Ford spec racer of this car to be released and add all the good stuff in the box (I must be dreaming!) On the bright side, Revell announced some diecast cancellations because of demand from retailers for more plastic kits. HHHMMM! The other surprise was Polar Lights issuing the 2005 Ford GT (AKA the new Ford GT40) It is unknown if this will a curbside or full kit. I doubt the latter, as it will be pre-painted.

Meanwhile, back at Ertl, there were 11 new cars called "trends" that are repops with custom wheels. What's that all about? How many cruise nights do you go to where some guy "garred up" his muscle car with some "rims"? Maybe in the city, and put the spinners on them too, ooohhh, way cool! Yeah! At least Revell did it right, with the California Wheels series where you get both stock and custom wheels in the box. And they also showed some more "new" NASCAR kits with outdated everything. Make room on the swap tables, more are coming! They also said a new kit of the 2005 Bentley Continental, but of course no licensing yet. It's funny, last year I talked to the Airfix rep and asked him why they don't make a Bentley or a new Rolls kit. Do the walls have ears in Rosemont? Well, here's the complete list- Enjoy!

Kit Review: 1/32 Hornby Porsche 911 GT3R

With all the varied subjects that are modeled as 1/32 slot cars, I had often wondered why we can't get more of these as static models. Then I ran across a series of kits by the English company Hornby, which were initially slot cars but have also been adapted to static models. I am aware of six kits, the Ford Focus, Subaru Impreza and Mitsubishi Lancer WRC cars, the 1969 Penske Camaro and Parnelli Jones Mustang Trans Am racers, and the Porsche 911 GT3R. Since for some reason there are no race versions of the GT3 in 1/24, I decided to try this kit.

The subject of this kit is the Porsche 911GT3R that raced at the Rolex 24 Hours of Daytona. It was entered by the Peterson White Lightening team. This kit has 30 pieces, in white and clear with vinyl tires.

It is a curbside kit, similar in level of assembly to the Tamiya 1/24 Porsche GT2 and GT3 kits. The chassis has the front suspension and engine bottom molded in, with several separate rear suspension pieces. The exhaust system is also two separate pieces.

The interior is almost complete. There is a roll cage, shifter, steering wheel and fire extinguisher. But due to being a converted slot car body, the rear half of the interior tub is raised (to clear the electric motor in a slot car), so that is a bit inaccurate for a static kit.

The body is one piece, there is no opening hood or engine cover. The rear wing is one large separate piece. The interior glass is one piece that fits in from the inside. The head and taillights are clear and fit on the outside.

The wheels are nicely molded spoked units, with vinyl tires. There are no tire markings, either molded on or decals.

The biggest drawback to this kit is the markings. Instead of waterslide decals they are stick ons, very thick. Interestingly there are no tire logos either on the body or tires.

In summary, this is a nice shelf model of a car I have been waiting for. While I haven't built it yet, I have seen Hornby slot cars and the bodies are nicely done. The markings are a disappointment, I may try to see if there are any alternatives in the slot racing market. While I would prefer 1/24, if more previously unavailable subjects come out in 1/32 I would build them

CA Glue Tips By Elliot Doering

Obviously, we model builders all use CA glues when doing our models. In past years, I'd just bop over to Walgreens or a hardware store, or buy the "ZAP" brand stuff at Alex. The "cheap stuff" always comes in maybe a "2 squirt" micro bottle, for up to\$3.00 - that's BALONEY! This "use it once & toss it out" baloney just ain't gettin' it! The crap always hardens, clogs or evaporates in the bottle too. Sooooooo, I got on the Net and found a Milwaukee based packaging supply shop that carries all kinds of CA products. Talked to Mike, and... luckily his CA supplier was sitting right next to him, so bounced numerous questions off them both.

They did tell me that a quart size bottle would be overkill, as it does evaporate somewhat, or it'll harden or turn thicker. But... he recommends two (2) ounce bottles, in a ten pack. He said use the THIN, LOW viscosity stuff, with hardener/"kicker" in 8 oz. pump bottles. Also, we can prolong the shelf life of the stuff by sticking it in the refrigerator. Just like film! So, I ordered some of it. I'll be the "guinea pig" on this, and will let you know how it goes/works, and then if it proves to be a-ok, I will post my comments.
