The May meeting was back at the Fountains of Crystal Lake, on the usual third Saturday, May 20. After the treasury and business updates, we moved on to Show and Tell.

Among the stuff on display:

Michael Larson: Tamiya Mercedes CLK-GTR.







Building the 1981 LeMans 24 Hour Race Winner in 1/24 Scale



Subject: Porsche 936-81 Kit: Porsche 936-78

Mfg: Tamiya

Kit #24012 Scale: 1/24

To sports car racing fans, June of course means the 24 Hours of LeMans at the Sarthe circuit in northern France. So I thought this would be a good month to describe building one of the cars that won the race. For modelers, kits of many of the winning cars have been issued by various manufaturers over the years, in all scales. Being a Porsche fan, when Tamiya reissued a run of their 936-78 Porsche kits a few years ago, I picked one up.

Having built one many years ago, I was going to do another one to see if my skills have improved. But the car replicated in the kit did not win in 1978, it finished second. So when I saw some aftermarket decals by Scale Designs on a table at the old Strictly 43rd show a few years ago, I decided to build the car that won the race in 1981.

History: After the classic years of protoytpe racing in the 60's and early 70's, the cars evolved into more production based vehicles, like the Porsche 934/35. Great race cars, but not as sleek as the earlier Ferrari and Porsche prototypes. Later rules changes allowed Porsche to develop the 936 series of prototypes for the LeMans 24 Hours contest, versions of which competed from 1976 thru 1981.

The 936 was a very sucessful race car, the long tail chassis was based on the 908, with open cockpit bodywork and was first brought to LeMans in 1976. Run by the factory team in the famous Martini Racing markings, it won the race in 1976 and 1977, Jacky Ickx codriving both years, and finished second in 1978. After that private teams ran the car. The 1981 winner actually was an offshoot of the Porsche Indy program from 1979, which was canceled at the last minute due to some political issues with the GTR Auto Modelers Newsletter

Indy/USAC people. The turbo 3.0 liter engine designed for Indy was modified for endurance racing and installed in the old 936 chassis and designated 936-81. With Jacky Ickx now teamed with Derek Bell, it dominated the event in 1981, again as a factory entry but with Jules replacing Martini as the title sponsor.


<u>Kit:</u> This kit by Tamiya was initially available in the late 70's when the real car was still active. Like most Tamyia kits of that vintage, it was designed be to a motorized model, with space for an electric motor, gears, etc. Fortunately for this subject, other than being a curbside kit without a full engine, it still allows for a fairly accurate replica, that with a little extra work does build into a nice curbside shelf model.



The Build: Making the 1981 winner out of the kit of the car that finished second in 1978 is a relatively easy task. The exterior of the cars are very simlar. As noted above, the main difference in 1981 was the engine, but since this is a curbside and simplified in design, that is not an issue.

There are several minor modifications to the body. There was a small clear windscreen added for the 1981 winner which was not in the original kit. The bulge in the front "hood" vent/duct should be removed and the openning sanded smooth. Also the fuel filler needs to be filled in and moved back on the body to replicate the car in the race.

Of course the markings are the most notable difference. There have been several options, for this build I used the Scale Designs sheet pictured below. This one is no longer in production, but an alternative would be the sheet by Fred Cady. The stripes over the top of the scoop were tricky to match up, but Solvaset helped snuggle them down. I probably put it a bit too high which threw off the number roundel a bit but it doesn't look too bad.



The paint scheme is basic white, I used Tamiya lacquer from the rattle can. There is red striping around the nose, but by that time I did not want to mask and paint so I cut out some of the red from the Martini decals that come in the kit and applied it in pieces. Some photos I have seen of the real car look more flourescent but I am not sure if that was the restored car which might be a little different than the original. Also I used the headlight borders around the front lenses.

The body modifications mentioned I did not find out about until the paint was on, but they are minor enough so I left them off.



The interior is pretty basic, I painted the seats Tamiya gray acrlic, with some aluminum around the side panels. The dash is flat black

with painted details for the insturments. I did add some seatbelts from masking tape with some photo etch buckles from the parts bin.



The chassis pretty basic, it is molded in black so I left most of it as is. There is molded in detail for the bottom of the engine, and seperate exhausts. I painted this aluminum with some weathering and washes, also there are frame rails visible that I painted aluminum.



The wheels covers were painted black with gold spoke decals. The Dunlop lettering was also on the decal sheet. The wheels mount on metal axles, however the rear wheels needed several spacers to line up correctly as the gear that was to be used with the electric motor was not included. The front wheels mount with some pins from the outside, there are no pins for the back so I cut some large headed nails and glued them on to balance it out then, painted them all metalic grey.

Overall this is a straightforward build that resulted in a colorful replica of a LeMans winner as driven by two famous drivers.


