Porsche to acquire majority stake in Volkswagen from cars.about.com 3/11/08

Porsche appears to be well on its way to becoming one of the world's biggest automakers. Porsche plans to up its 31% stake in the Volkswagen Group to over 50%, giving it control of the company. Volkswagen owns several brands we see here in the United States (Audi, Bentley, Lamborghini and Bugatti) as well as several we don't (SEAT, Skoda, and truckmakers MAN and Scania). Porsche's plan is to topple Toyota as the number-one selling automaker in the world.

Random Thoughts By Les Whitfield

2007 was a good year for Porsche. Profits tripled over 2006. Earnings for 2007 were \$6.18B (as in billion, take that Toyota). Most of this can be credited to its partial ownership in VW. Revaluation of Porsche's 31% ownership of VW resulted in a one-time gain of almost \$760M. 20% of VW is owned by a German state (I find that scary where a government can control a business). The German state of Lower Saxony can create a roadblock to Porsches acquiring a 75% stake in the company needed for domination. The Government plans to maintain its 21% stake to protect the 82,000 VW jobs. The articles of association allow minority investors with at least a 20% stake in the company to block certain key strategic decisions. By the way Porsche employs 12,000 workers while VW employs 324,000 people.

A recent European court decision, reported on PBS Nightly Business Report, struck down the German law limiting non-German investors from purchasing majority stakes in German companies. I guess people in Germany are as afraid of outsiders taking over their businesses just as Americans are. After Porsches supervisory board approved an increase of 50% of VW, VW announced the purchase of Sweden's truck firm Skoda. Money has not been an obstacle for Porsche. Porsche has already borrowed 10 Billion Euros. The shareholders have authorized it to raise its share capital worth another 10 Billion Euros. In his column in Forbes magazine on the best-run automotive company in the world Jerry Flint (who has been following the industry since 1958) named Porsche.

Are you aware that Porsche paid \$5 million in CAFE fines in 2001? That is another reason for its interest in combining with VW. This way they can combine their emissions and fuel economy numbers with VW and lower them.

Are you aware VW supplies 30% of Porsches parts?

A recent fire at the 911 plant halted production for a short time. I am sure all the GTR members with one on order are relieved.

California based Tesla, producer of electric vehicles, began to produce of the Tesla Roadster at a Lotus plant in England on March 17. 600 units will be built this year and are sold out. 2009 will produce 100 units a month and there are already orders for 400. The zero emission vehicle (except for the emissions belched out at the electric plant so you can charge it) has a driving range of 230 miles and up to 60 miles per hour.

Ford Motor Company finally dumped Land Rover and Jaguar to Indian auto manufacturer TATA for \$2.6 Billion. That is 1/3 what they paid for them eight years ago (remember that \$6 Billion figure?). They must also put \$600 Million into the Jag-Land Rover pension fund. Now if they could get rid of money losing Volvo, all purchased when Jacque Nasser was president, their bottom line may improve. I wish they kept Aston-Martin.

The Chicago Auto Show is long gone. I found it somewhat boring. All the manufacturers did have something to showcase (Ford with the Shelby, VW with the bright blue Jetta diesels, Cadillac with the new CTS in bright colors, the Corvettes [and the chassis display] in their special colors, Acura with red cars, the blue Dodge SuperBee). But, the rest of the show was gray or silver blah. Just boring. No wonder the country has no excitement. Everything is neuter. In the car shows I went to as a kid the manufacturers showed off their best. They created excitement. Now the excitement is as bad as is their bottom line, my opinion anyway.

I did enjoy seeing Ginger Zee, the channel 5 weather girl, who is prettier in person.

Gasoline prices are going to go wayyyyy up. Diesel will go beyond the gas increases according to insiders because the plants cannot increase production of diesel due to the way the plants are constructed. Changing the plants to produce more diesel is supposedly expensive and would take years. That never stopped the government from doing things. According to Nightly Business Report on March 26, 2008; the cracking plants are running at only 82.2%, below the rate during the October 2005 hurricane season. Valero Energy, the nation's largest refiner, admitted reducing supply because of low margins (reported in the same program). If things are not bad enough there the price of a bushel of wheat has doubled in the past year because farmers are producing more corn for ethanol. With the high prices of corn I do not understand why farmers are getting subsidies from the government. I just love the Indy type car need to switch from menthol wood based alcohol for which there is no shortage to ethanol that is corn based. I guess I will be watching reruns of old sitcoms instead of racing from those groups. What will I snack on? Maybe fruit instead of chips. They will probably be cheaper. We do have one salvation to these high oil prices. Fadel Gheit, Oil and Gas Analyst of Oppenheimer & Co. mentioned if there is a recession prices will come down as people will not purchase as much and there will be an over supply.





Kit Review: Ferrari 250 GTO

Mfg: Revell Germany

Kit #: 07395 Scale: 1/24




The 250 GTO, that is still regarded as one of the finest of all Ferraris, was designed with the primary aim of suitability for private use, but at the same time for winning races in the three-litre class. The Gran Turismo body shape was aerodynamically optimised and resulted in a perfect combination of suitability for purpose and beauty. The front of the 250 GTO was particularly attractive due to the three cooling vents for the 2953 cc engine. The 250 stood for the capacity of one of the 12 engine cylinders, the O for omologato (= type approved), the FIA approval for races in the GT class. The GTO was shown for the first time in 1962. Thanks to its 300 hp engine and good aerodynamics it achieved a speed of about 280 km/h with acceleration from 0 to 100 in just 5.6 seconds. For three whole years (1962, 1963 and 1964) the GTO dominated its racing class in inimitable style.



This kit is a reissue of a kit from I believe either Protar or Fujimi. It is a full detail model, lots of parts. It is molded in white and black plastic, with a chrome tree for small details and multi piece chrome wire wheels that mount on rubber tires. The body features separate movable bonnet, doors and boot lid. Molding looks nice and clean considering the age of the tool, minimal mold lines and flash.



There is a detailed, multi-part 12-cylinder engine featuring six Weber carbs. Separate exhaust assemblies (for road and race versions) are included.



Included are decals and detailed painting instructions for one road and two racing versions. Included are decals for the blue Mecom Team car #24 driven by Roger Penske and a green #47 driven by David Piper.
