He developed the HANDS HELD HIGH to show unity among Black motorists. The accessory serves as a statement of declaration of equal rights and respect. It helps raise awareness of racial issues, and it is designed as a conversation piece. The unit adds a decorative, personalized touch to the vehicle. Additionally, the invention is suitable for display in any motor vehicle, desktop or any flat surface. Also, considerations could be made for producing it in keychains, t-shirts and baseball caps.
