"When I wear one, it crushes up my clothes and is just plain uncomfortable. To help people wear a seat belt more comfortable and safely, I invented this."

He developed the patent-pending C.R.S.A. to allow a seat belt to be worn more comfortably. The accessory prevents the belt from crushing or wrinkling clothing. The device promotes proper seat-belt use. This is designed to enhance roadway safety and offer added peace of mind. Additionally, it is adaptable for use with both new and existing vehicles.
