"I thought it would be great if police had an easier way to tell whether or not the occupants of a vehicle were buckled up so that they could target these motorists specifically."

She developed the SEATBELT LIGHT to provide a readily visible way to indicate if the vehicle occupants are wearing their seat belts. This enables police officers to target vehicles with occupants who are not securely buckled. The invention promotes regular seat-belt use, which is designed to enhance roadway safety. The system helps ensure compliance with the law. Additionally, it is adaptable for use with any new or existing vehicle.
