

## **Survey Finds Majority Believe Kerry Plan for Energy Independence Achievable**

Results of month-long, online survey of EVWorld. Com readers shows that 55% believe American energy independence is attainable goal.

(PRWEB) September 3, 2004 -- Democratic presidential candidate Senator John Kerry has proposed a plan to eventually make the United States "energy independent", especially of Mideast oil. With America now importing sixty-three percent of its oil, a sum amounting to 13 million barrels of petroleum daily, the task of weaning a nation with more than 230 million motor vehicles, virtually all dependent on gasoline or diesel fuel, is a significant logistical and political challenge, even by 2020.

EVWorld.Com, a leading Internet publication on advanced transportation technologies, polled its readers asking them the following question. "John Kerry is proposing making the USA energy independent from Middle East oil. Do you believe American energy independence is an achievable goal?"

During the month-long survey conducted between August 1 and September 1, 2004, a total of 2,423 readers responded . 55 percent (1,340) answered "yes", while 42 percent (1030) indicated "no". Two percent (53) said they "didn't know".

While the results of EV World's survey are not considered scientific and reflect the personal views of readers who are interested in electric-drive and other alternative fuel vehicle technologies, they do suggest that among this group, the majority believe energy independence is an attainable goal. EV refers to "electric vehicle."
