

## **NCDOT Announces Work Zone Towing Enforcement**

The N.C. Department of Transportation (NCDOT) began towing vehicles left unattended in the U.S 1/64 work zone in Cary on January 20.

Raleigh, NC (<u>PRWEB</u>) January 27, 2005 -- The N.C. Department of Transportation (NCDOT) began towing vehicles left unattended in the U.S 1/64 work zone in Cary on January 20. Vehicles are being towed to designated areas adjacent to the project to prevent congestion during construction activities and to help maintain the flow of traffic through the work zone.

Vehicles will be towed by BarbourÂ□s Towing to one of two locations. Vehicles left on the southbound lanes of U.S. 1/64 will be towed to the Tryon Road interchange area and vehicles left on the northbound lanes of U.S. 1/64 will be towed to the Walnut Street interchange area. Owners can call the project information line at 888-303-3101 for more information about their vehicles and the towing policy.

The U.S. 1/64 widening project is a \$58 million project, that is anticipated to be completed in late 2006 and will improve U.S. 1/64 from south of the I-40 interchange to the U.S. 64/Tryon Road interchange in Cary.

The NCDOT reminds motorists to stay alert in the U.S. 1/64 construction zone, obey the posted speed limit of 55 mph, be aware of construction workers and watch signs for construction information. The fine for speeding in the work zone is \$250 and three driver license points.
