Headlining the show will be Rebel Recording artist, David Davis & the Warrior River Boys form Cullman, Alabama. Also Southern MarylandÂ \Box s own Jay Armsworthy & Eastern Tradition from California, Maryland will be on hand. As you can see, Bluegrass music from all points of the East Coast will be coming to Cheltenham, Maryland for this annual event.

David Davis & the Warrior River Boys play Bluegrass in the mold of the music's pioneers...with heart, soul, and conviction. David himself is a singer and mandolin player of the highest degree and the Warrior River Boys provide the perfect complement to DavidÂ \Box s talents. David has a voice that spans time, a voice that conjures up the ghosts of a thousand generations.
