The still-pushrod V8 engine, now dubbed "LS2," is now up to 6.0 liters, more efficient than ever, and has a higher redline of 6,500 RPM. Handling has also been sharpened, and both length and width have been trimmed for more agility. The interior got a complete overhaul to address complaints about cheapness, and the Corvette has finally ditched its old pop-up headlights.

As if this weren't enough, power-hungry enthusiasts have the 2006 Corvette Z06 to look forward to. Since the base Corvette is now up to 400 horsepower, its 405 simply won't do. So Chevrolet kicked that up all the way to 500, which is sure to steal the crown from the Dodge Viper of being America's fastest mass-produced sports car, while undercutting the \$85,000 Viper by tens of thousands of dollars.
