

Automotive HistorianÂ□s Estate Draws Worldwide Attention

Over the course of the last few months thousands of enthusiasts, including many museums, have been competing to acquire a piece of this historic estate.

Competition has been extremely aggressive and has pushed some pieces to record prices. An original watercolor on paper by Walter Gotschke, sold for \$3,850. An original watercolor by Peter Helck of Train Scene sold for \$3,410. Divan Japonais, an original poster by Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec, sold for \$32,200. An original poster, "Maurin Quina" by Cappiello, ca. 1920 sold for \$2,000. A Camera Work Special Steichen Supplement dated April 1906 sold for \$4,620.
