The Sumner Police Department is located in the city of Sumner, Iowa. Having two officers to cover a city with a population of 9,451, the Sumner Police Department has limited resources to enforce speed limits across the city. The Sumner Police Department plans to use their Shield 12 sign to help reduce speeding and address speeding complaints in their community.

This new Shield sign will be very beneficial to the City of Sumner and will make the community safer by drawing awareness to the citizens of Sumner of the speed limits." said Officer Alex Hertges of the Sumner Police Department.
