

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GTR Mailbag

New F1 and Indy Cars

As the 2012 racing season opens, we are seeing new designs in the major open wheel series.

Formula 1 cars seem to be getting uglier, not only with all the aerodynamic appendages stuck on but now with a noticeable drop down in the nose section.



It appears the negative buzz over this already has made the rules makers ban it for next year.

And Indy Car has gone to the new spec Dallara chassis. While the front is smoother than on F1 cars, the wider side pods, all the way out to the wheels, make the cars look like 1980's Cam Am cars from certain angles.





This is especially true from the rear, as there is rear bodywork extending across the rear wheels. Most of this new bodywork is designed to prevent the cars going airborne when they touch wheels.



Next year teams will be able to use different aero packages, such as wings and body parts, so it will be interesting to see how they look in 2013.

Datsun to return?

Nissan is thinking of reviving its former nameplate, Datsun, in 2014, if a report by the Japanese news agency Nikkei is to be believed.

The report, which did not cite sources, said that Nissan wants to create a lower-cost subbrand to better compete in countries such as Russia, India and Indonesia. The cars would cost roughly twice that of the Indian-built Tata Nano, the world's cheapest production car, or about \$6,100 at today's exchange rates. There are even plans, according to Nikkei, of a 0.8-liter engine destined for Russia. Warranties would be shorter than on regular Nissan cars.

Farewell to VW Vocho Taxis



Mexico's capital is ready to stomp out its iconic Volkswagen "Bug" taxis. Officials have announced that the last of the old-style VW Beetles will have their cab licenses expire by the end of the year, marking the end of apart of Mexico City life.

The rounded, two-door sedan nicknamed the Bug — in Mexico, it's a "Vocho" —at its height in 2006, accounted for almost half of all taxis in Mexico City, with about 50,000 cruising the streets.

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Today, there are only about 3,500 of the privately owned and operated Bugs among 130,000 taxis.

The model hasn't been manufactured since 2003, when the last one rolled off an assembly line in the Mexican state of Puebla. For safety reasons, Mexico City began mandating four-door taxis in 2003. So the Beetles that entered service in 2002 are the last to operate as cabs. Most car models are limited by the city to eight years of service as taxis, but the Bug was allowed a 10-year run — and that ends with 2012.

New Viper Leaked by Hot Wheels

The new (Dodge) SRT Viper is set for a world premiere at the New York Auto Show in April. But apparently Hot Wheels has jumped the gun and released pictures of its new release before the real thing debuted?



NISSAN to Power Delta Wing



The Delta Wing (which was potentially the new Indy Car chassis until the Dallara was chosen) will be powered by Nissan when it debuts at the LeMans 24 Hours in June. It ran its first demo laps at Sebring in Nissan markings. Below is the car as it appeared at the Chicago Auto Show in February.



New ALMS GT Racers



Lotus will join the ALMS series with a one car GT class entry from Alex Job Racing, who historically has run Porsches. The Lotus Evora will join the series at Long Beach for the rest of the season.



And Aston Martin raced a new Vantage GT class car at Sebring and will be at several early US races before going to compete in the full World Endurance Championship schedule.

Trans-Am Race Co. has announced that it will partner with GoRacingTV.com to provide a unique form of video coverage for the 2012 season. 
2012 GTR Summer NNL

2012 GTR Club Project



1/43 Model Building and Collecting Pt 1

While attending the NNL East in New Jersey with my friend Mike Siegman, we discussed an interesting idea regarding 1/43 models. Over the years both Mike and I have been avid 1/43 model builders and collectors. So we thought it would be interested to write a story focused on 1/43 model building and collecting.

The world of 1/43 model kit building has changed dramatically over the years. The number of new kits being released has gone down significantly in the last few years. In addition, the prices have gone up to very high levels. I know everyone who buys models will not be surprise at this because the same thing has happened with plastic model kits. So I thought I would take you back to the time when I started building and collecting 1/43 models and review the history of 1/43 models as I remember it.

So let's go back to when I got started on 1/43 scale models and how I found out about them. It started in about 1974 and my friend, Larry Fulhorst, showed me a John Day Brabham BT44 kit. It was all white metal except for the wheel/tire combination which was one piece and molded plastic. In order to mold them, the tires were hollowed out on the inside. By any standards, these kits were crude. But they offered the subject matter that I couldn't find in any other models. The models were of Formula 1, Can Am and LeMans cars. These were just what I was interested in then and now. Also the basic shapes and proportions of the models were more like models and not toys. With a little work, they could be made into a reasonably accurate model. I also liked the size because if you added a little detail, it looked like a lot. The size also let me display them without taking up much room.



Ed's First 1/43 build

Just like the direction we are heading today, there was only one place in the USA to get 1/43 John Day Models. His name was Jacques Grelley and he owned, of all things, a restaurant down in Chicago. He didn't sell them at the restaurant so all the John Day Models were sold by mail order. But I would also run into Jacques at the top of the viewing area outside Turn 5 at Road America, Elkhart Lake. He would

have built versions of the models on a small fold up card table. Can you picture that today?

Then later I got a notice from Jacques about a new model from a French company called AMR and it was like everything changed. These models were still all white metal, but they were much better quality all the way through. Once I had an AMR model I just had to find out what else was out there. OH, if we only had the internet then.

With Jacques the only game in the USA, I decided to try Canada and found a dealer called Mini Grid. It was run by George Maxwell, one great guy. Just like Jacques it was a small mail order business, but George was much more into the whole field of 1/43 models. He had lines from all over Europe and England. In addition he had accessory parts such as wheels with real rubber tires. Now I could replace those bad John Day wheel/tire pieces. The other kits ranged in quality between the John Days and the AMRs. Some of the early brands were Tenariv, Esdo, Meri, Mini Racing, FDS, GPM, Tron, Record, Racing 43 and many others. I actually built kits from all of these brands and more. But sadly to my knowledge none of these brands are still making kits today.

Once I started to get these other kits, it really opened things up for me. For example, a line of kits from England called Scale Racing Cars had very well done Cosworth engines. Now I could take a John Day body which was reasonably accurate and replace its crude engine with something better. The final result was a real improvement. By this time, these other 1/43 model lines started to eclipse John Day and he faded away. A few years ago I found an interesting interview article with John Day. He explained what happened for him during this period. He just didn't feel like taking that next step and improving his product.

As we entered the late 70s, other shops and mail order businesses started to come along such as Model Car Masterpieces and Valley Plaza Hobbies both on the west coast. There were even American 1/43 model makers such as Precision Miniatures. I'll go into these in more detail in the next installment.

Scale Designs Porsche 356 Carrera Panamericana Decals

The Carrera Panamericana races were 2,000 miles over open roads in Mexico, similar to such European races as the Targa Florio and Mille Miglia. They were held to commemorate the opening of the Pan American Highway thru Mexico. They were held five times, 1950-54, being cancelled as too dangerous in the aftermath of the 1955 LeMans tragedy and after 27 people were killed in the running of the races.

At last year's Ferrari Expo I picked up some Scale Designs decals for Porsche 356s that raced in the Carrera races in 1952-53. These are early versions of the 356, pre 356A, so any kit in 1/24 needs to be heavily backdated.



Several years ago I had picked up two motorized toy 356s for \$1 each. They looked like a 356, but upon closer inspection there were a lot of inaccuracies, so after I started to strip one and tear it down I gave it up. But once I had these decals, I wanted to build the blue and white Guatemalan sponsored car so I picked up the project with the goal of making a replica racer, not the actual race car. Other than some toy like proportions, there was only one grille on the engine cover and different exhausts and lights. And the toy had a lousy interior so I painted the clear windows black to make it a slammer.



But eventually it looks like a 356 for a shelf display model. I painted it with Tamiya rattle can lacquers and applied the decals. The wheels came from a Revell kit of the 356 Speedster club racer that was reissued some years ago. Not exactly right but they look like Porsche wheels.



The decals were printed for Scale Designs by Cartograf in Italy; they went on perfectly, with great coverage. Since this is not an accurate body style I can't really comment on the fit but they sure look great on the car. Tom Tanner of Scale Designs has done the work to build accurate version of these cars and showed then at the Ferrari Expo so if you want to go all out these will allow you to do cars from the 1952 or 1953 events.


