


"To be a world leader in the archiving of historic automotive & motor racing research materials"














The Project:

The large format (12x12in), hard-back, 256-page book captures the drama and atmosphere behind the scenes at race circuits in the UK and Europe in the 1960s and early 70s. The book will feature over 200 images from the Auto-Archives library, taken by Peter Darley. The book is divided into ten chapters; Brands Hatch, Clermont-Ferrand, Crystal Palace, Goodwood, Jarama, Monte Carlo, Monza, Oulton Park, Silverstone and Snetterton each focusing on its uniqueness. Featuring drivers such as Dan Gurney, Phil Hill, Jackie Stewart and Jochen Rindt, along with many iconic race cars from the 60s and 70s (Cobra, Brabham, Lotus, Ferrari and Jaguar to mention just a few) the book will show how the drivers, mechanics, marshals and cars made racing back then really special for us enthusiasts, today. These unique never before seen images portray a world that is sadly long gone. Produced to the highest production standards, this stunning book steers clear of images of the cars on track, and zooms in on the real world of the mechanics, drivers and owners from this iconic period of motor racing.

Lord March a good friend of Peter Darley, has kindly written the foreword to the book. Lord March is hugely respected as the creator of both the Goodwood Festival of Speed and the Goodwood Revival, and the Goodwood circuit is of course one of the tracks featured in Pit & Paddock.
