

# LULAC, General Motors Foundation Open New Technology Lab at The University of Texas at Arlington

*New Lab will Offer Computer Assistance with College Applications and Information About STEM Programs* 

Arlington, Texas (<u>PRWEB</u>) January 20, 2016 -- The League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC) and the General Motors Foundation have partnered to open a technology lab in the Center for Mexican American Studies (CMAS) at The University of Texas at Arlington (UTA). The effort is part of LULAC's Empower Hispanic America with Technology initiative, which focuses on closing the digital divide in the Latino community. To that end, UTA students will offer computer assistance with college applications and information about STEM programs through the new lab.
