To encourage new ways of moving people faster and more efficiently with rapid transit, the FTA formed the BRT communities $\hat{A} \square$ consortium. This unique public-private partnership is staging $\hat{A} \square$ buses of the future □ competition to foster a new and innovative service called Bus Rapid Transit (BRT). The rules say the bus and transit system design must $\hat{A} \square$ meet new transportation goals, is environmentally cleaner and is more customer-oriented, user-friendly and visually appealing.Â Who Can Enter? Students, industrial and urban designers, planners, architects, landscape architects, interior designers and engineers are eligible. Additional skills may be taken from graphic designers, artists, management or anyone able to contribute to an insightful and creative entry.

\$50 early registration closes 1/07/2001. The competition involves two phases. The 1st phase is due Feb. 28, 2001 and phase 2 is due May 15th. The judges include: Martha Wellborne, project director of the Surface Transit Project; Hans Rat, secretary general of the International Assn. of Public Transport (UITP); and World-Renown Industrial Designer Tucker Viemeister, Razorfish so far.
