NASCAR's Michael Waltrip spent Easter Sunday at the test weekend at the historic Circuit de la Sarthe in France testing the AF Corse Ferrari F430 he will race in the 24 hours of Le Mans on June 11-12. It was the first time on the track for Waltrip, who said "Once I knew where the turns were I was having a great time." He completed the ten laps required of LeMans rookies to take part in the race.



Tom Kristensen set the fastest time on the Test Day with a best lap at 3:27.687 in the new closed top No. 03 Audi which ended up only eight seconds slower than the 2010 pole winning time.



Trump to drive 2011 Indy 500 Pace Car

Global business icon Donald J. Trump will drive the 2011 Chevrolet Camaro Convertible Pace Car to lead the field of 33 drivers to the start of the 100th Anniversary Indianapolis 500 on Sunday, May 29 at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

"It's a great honor to be selected as the Pace Car driver for such an American institution as the 100th anniversary of the Indianapolis 500," Trump said. "The Indianapolis 500 has been the gold standard of motorsports for a century, and I can't wait to get behind the wheel of the Camaro and bring the famous field of 33 drivers to the green flag."



Harry Coover – Super Glue Inventor

The man who invented super glue died last month at the age of 94. Coover discovered it in 1951 while employed in an Eastman Kodak lab. It

was originally marketed as Kodak 910. It wasn't until after the patents expired that super glue became a successful consumer product. As a result, Coover never realized any financial gain from his discovery. His family said he was proud of the fact that it began to be used for medical purposes on battlefield during the Vietnam war era.

Kimi to NASCAR Trucks?

Kimi Raikkonen will pay a reported \$100,000 per race as he moves to establish a career in America's premier NASCAR series. Team owner Kyle Busch has never met Kimi Raikkonen" but will "entrust one of his excellent trucks" to the Finn "in exchange for a US\$100,000 cheque at every race".

Following news F1's world champion of 2007 is combining his world rallying with NASCAR in 2011, it has been confirmed that the 31-year-old has signed with Kyle Busch to debut in the Truck Series race in Charlotte next month.

Raikkonen's plan is to "pay for some truck races to raise interest and get a sponsorship budget for Nationwide and possibly the (premier) Sprint Cup". His contract with Busch is reportedly for three to five races. Raikkonen has tested the truck at the Gresham half-mile oval.

Next Generation Beetle from VW


Volkswagen has unveiled the latest generation 2012 Beetle at the Shanghai and New York Auto Shows.



To be built in Chattanooga, TN, the latest generation moves away from design of the New Beetle of 1998 and instead draws on cues from the original and Beetle Ragster concept shown in Detroit in 2005. As such it's longer, wider and lower, giving a more masculine and dynamic appearance. It should be available in September 2011

April GTR Meeting



Tim Leicht: Round 2/AMT NASCAR Impala kit, almost built up.








and the latest Revell Germany 1/24 Mercedes F1 kit – check out one page of the amazing looking decals!



Kit Review: Hasegawa 1/12 Honda WGP Cycle

I'll admit it: I'm not a huge racing fan. However, that said, whenever I can, I love to watch World Grand Prix motorcycle racing. There's something visceral and compelling about seeing racers leaned over in a turn, dragging their knees over the candy canes through a turn only to have them open the throttle on the exit and go from 50 mph to 150 mph in a few seconds. No roll cages, no advanced crumple zones, and nothing between them and the road but a hockey puck and some leather. I've modeled a few race bikes in the past from another model maker (Alex Criville's 500cc Repsol Hondas from 1998 and 1999, and Kenny Roberts 500cc Yamaha from the 1980s), so it was with great anticipation I opened the box on Hasegawa's entry into the race bike market.

In years past, WGP racing was divided into distinct classes, divided by engine capacity. From 1990 through 2009, the 250cc class was the stepping stone to greatness, and the place where champions were born – riders such as Valentino Rossi, Jorge Lorenzo, and Max Biaggi were champions at 250cc before making their mark on the 500cc circuits. For the 2010 season, WGP removed the 250cc class replacing it with the new Moto2 class, which specifies a 600cc four-stroke engine to replace the two-stroke 250cc engine used previously. This kit represents the 2009 bike May 2011 7 of 14 run by Hiroshi Aoyama, who won the 250cc championship that season.



Opening the box reveals some interesting choices. Two grey sprues and one white sprue contain the bulk of the parts for the bike. Two clear sprues were given for windshields. Two separate bags contained hoses, springs, and screws; two rubber tires were provided as well. As an interesting touch, body panels were provided in both white and clear plastic – more on that later.

Most interesting for this writer was what was lacking in the kit – chrome. There are no chrome parts given at all. The frame and front forks (what would normally be chromed on a race bike) were molded in white and grey plastic, with instructions to paint them "Shine Silver". I think I like this approach – most chrome is too shiny to be realistic. While painting natural metal finishes can be tricky, the intricacies of the frame pieces make this an easier task than, say, an airplane wing or automobile hood. As expected from Hasegawa, all the parts were very well done and finely engraved, with no sink holes or ejector pin marks on any of the parts. Looking through the parts, there were some things I was very glad to see.

The bike frame has molded-in weld lines with detail so fine, I couldn't see it immediately – I had to run my finger nail along it to feel it. Once painted, a fine black wash over this will add instant depth and realism to the welded frame pieces. The dual front brake rotors had vents holes molded open – no drilling out rotors for this kit. Like all race bikes, this bike is a water-bagger (liquid cooled), and the radiator provided has very fine detail on it with no scars or issues at all. Rubber tires are provided as well.

The engine is highly detailed, with 17 of the 145 parts of the kit going to it, and will be greatly enhanced by careful detail painting. The additional detail provided by the coolant lines will add to the realism in the engine once installed in the frame. And this is why the clear body panels are a welcome addition – rather than cover the superb detailing of the engine in opaque body panels, the modeler can opt to show them off with

clear plastic. I wish I had this on some of my previous kits.


As with other race bike kits, the wheels are held on by screws, and a real spring is given for the rear suspension. Also in the bag with these parts was the last surprise this kit had for me - athin piece of stiff wire. Scanning the instructions, I finally discovered that it's a hard line representing the stroke sensor that runs from the top of the right front brake cylinder up to the dashboard.

The instructions provided are very complete and detailed. As with all Japanese kits I've done, most of the text is in Japanese, with the most important text duplicated in English, German, French, Spanish, and Italian. Illustrations provided are very good, but in some places can be tough to read – for example, for the stroke sensor mentioned above, there's no clear depiction of where the top of it terminates. Paint colors provided are in GSI Creos and Mr. Color numbers. I would suggest using

stuff_eng_colorcharts_gunze.htm for color conversions to other systems. The painting instructions given throughout the kit are very well done, and the final painting suggestions (for Hiroshi Aoyama's 2009 season bike) are extremely detailed and complete, but appear easy to follow.

The decals are superb – very thin, with no extra carrier film where it isn't necessary. Carbon fiber decals are provided for certain parts, such as wrapped around the mufflers. The decals also contain the only bit of kit provided chrome, for the Scot logos on the front cowl – sorry for lying earlier. As with most race bike kits, the decals can be the most challenging part of the build, as they are numerous and need to conform to compound curves.



This is an extremely well-engineered kit. The parts are highly detailed and are executed with May 2011 8 of 14

near perfection. The removal of chrome sprues is not missed, and the addition of other details (such as hard lines, carbon fiber details, and clear body panels) adds to the uniqueness of Hasegawa's offering here. As WGP moves into the 21st century and changes formats, this last GP250 championship motorcycle is an important subject in WGP racing history, and Hasegawa has executed it with precision and expertise. I simply cannot wait to build this.

Product Review: *Hobby Design* Ferrari 599 GTO Transkit for *Fujimi* 599 GTB

Okay. I broke down and bought the Hobby Design Ferrari **599 GTO** transkit. I guess you can all thank me since Revell or Fujimi are now more likely to release one at a more reasonable price. That said, this transit is far better than the previous released 599XX which required major surgery on a Fujimi 599 body and grafting the parts on. I never got the 599XX transkit as I didn't have interest in building it. But several people said there were quality control issues on at least earlier runs. I have heard those have been addressed.



The real deal at the recent Ferrari Expo


I got the kit from **Mediamix Hobby**, an online hobby store located in Singapore that I have great success with on stuff that does not make it to the US. Their price was quite a bit better than other options, and they have great customer service. A couple of years back I ordered a Top Studio detail for the Tamiya F1-2000, **Mediamix**, on their own, sent a PDF file of the color instructions which are much easier to read than the provided black and white. A very nice touch. Try them out at:

Now, on to the transkit. The body is built off the Fujimi **599** and I've included pictures of the kit and instructions. Here you can see the Fujimi and HD bodies side by side.



The HD kit looms bigger since there is a big piece of flash below the sill that will need trimming.




You can also see the side sills are already attached to the body and the rear vents are included. Overall, the casting looks pretty clean and accurate. There appears to be some slight warpage, but nothing that can't be adjusted. I will need to do more analysis to see if there are any issues. But initial viewing looks good. Here are shots of the front and rear:






There are relief clips in the windshield and rear window for the vacuum forms supplied:




If one wanted to use the kit windows, some surgery would be required. Also included are the prototypical wheels (with tires), modified rear diffuser, seats, brake calipers, front spoiler clip and 3 sheets of photo-etch:

I will also be looking at combining this with the Revell 599 as I want full detail, including engine. I will need to test the fit and be very careful in opening the hood as resin is usually more brittle than styrene plastic. The biggest engine difference is a completely different intake air plenum and some slight variation with the air cleaner boxes.

It will be a while before I get more into this. I've got to catch up on some other kit work first. GTR April meeting attendees got to see this firsthand. I hope those that didn't make the last GTR meeting will find this useful.

Red Trim for NASCAR Wheels By Tim Leicht

(Last month we had a tip from Walt Fink on painting the red rims on NASCAR wheels. This month Tim Leicht presents a different technique to get the same results)

Some of you may already know about this technique, but for those that don't here you go. Want an easy way to get that outer pinstripe on your race wheels or even street wheels for that custom look? Here's how to do it:



First, decide on the color of the accent stripe. Then, make sure your wheels are prepped, sanded, painted in the primary color of your choice and you are ready to go.



Next, take a sheet of waxed paper, the backing sheet from a set of decals works great for this, or waxed paper works. Now, mix up and brush the color of the accent stripe on the paper. While it's still wet, take your wheel and pat the wheel into the paint swatch on a flat surface much like a printing pad, and pull it off. Do NOT let it sit on the paint swatch. If it doesn't cover the first time, no problem. Let the paint on the wheel tack up, prepare a new swatch of wet paint on the paper and do it again. By the second pass, you should have full coverage on the outside of the rim and no run over into the rest of the wheel. What you end up with is a nice, crisp outer accent stripe on the wheel, adding much more detail to your set of wheels and bringing out the tire detail as well with the contrast from the rim to the tire. Try it, it works!




