Based on information from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) web site, the media may report that General Motors will be announcing a noncompliance recall involving certain 2006 Chevrolet Uplander Cargo Vans.

These vehicles fail to conform to either Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 110 or 120 - Tire Selection and Rims. The vehicles do not have a tire and wheel information label because they were incorrectly designated as incomplete vehicles. For the same reason, GM did not install a complete vehicle certification label and the vehicles have a Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) with a GM designation for an incomplete vehicle.

To correct this condition, GM will send corrected labels to affected customers for self-installation and to involved dealers for installation in vehicles currently in their inventory. Customers will also be provided the option of taking their vehicle to a dealer for installation of the labels. Dealers will perform this repair at no charge to customers.

 ${\tt GM}$ will also send a letter to the National Insurance Crime Bureau identifying the VIN anomaly for the suspect vehicles.

A total of 291 vehicles are involved and GM is working with its supplier to obtain the replacement labels as quickly as possible. Dealers will be advised when a release date has been established for this recall.

GMVIS information for this recall will not be available until the recall bulletin is released to dealers.
