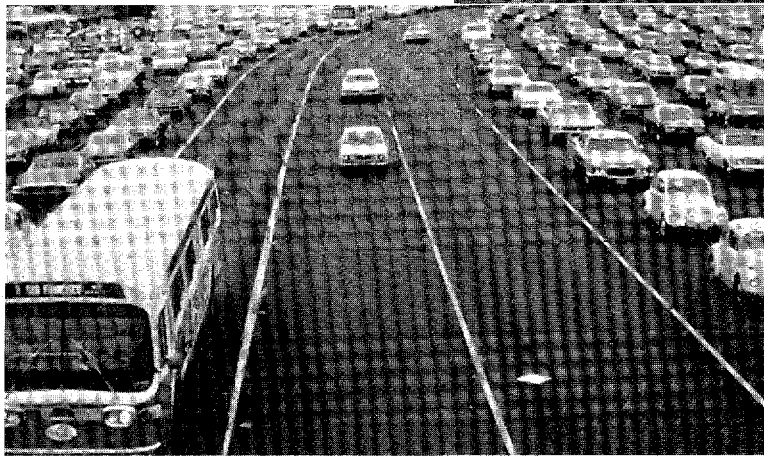
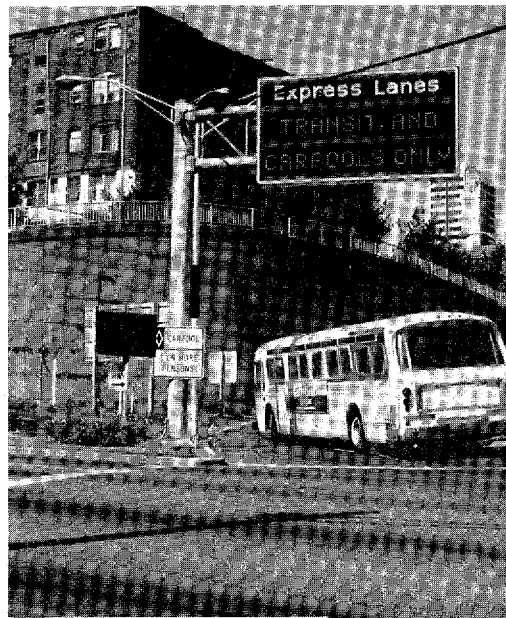

SELECTED HIGHWAY STATISTICS AND CHARTS - 1978

MOTOR FUEL

Highway use of motor fuel in 1978 increased by 4.5 percent over 1977. Motor fuel revenues in 1978, up 4.2 percent over 1977, are expected to increase slightly in 1979 over 1978 (0.8 percent). The increase is due to rate increases in 1979 and a carryover effect from 1978 increases.

Because of the energy shortages during 1979 and the resultant travel decreases, gasoline use in 1979 is estimated to be 2.4 percent below 1978. It is estimated that total 1979 fuel consumption for highway use will fall 1.6 percent below 1978.

Fuel efficiency average for all highway vehicles has shown continued improvement--1976, 12.20 miles per gallon; in 1977, 12.32 miles per gallon; in 1978, 12.38 miles per gallon.

MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS

Motor vehicle registrations in the Nation increased from 142,380,449 in 1977 to 148,777,765 in 1978, an increase of 4.5 percent. Motor vehicle revenues increased 9.2 percent in 1978 over 1977. It is estimated that 1979 registrations will exceed 1978 by 3.8 percent for a total of 154,502,000.

DRIVER LICENSING

The 140.8 million total licensed drivers in 1978 reflects a 2 percent increase over 1977, and a 1.6 percent increase is expected in 1979. The rate of increase seems to be slowing somewhat, perhaps due to a declining birth rate since the late 1950's and a saturation of the driving-age population. In 1978, 84.2 percent of persons 15 and over were licensed drivers.

The male portion of the drivers, 53.67 percent, increased 1.5 percent, while the female segment increased by 2.5 percent over 1977. Drivers aged 24 years and under make up 13.4 percent of the total licensed drivers.

There was almost one driver per registered automobile, and each driver averaged 10,992 vehicle miles of travel.

HIGHWAY FINANCE

Highway-user imposts, mainly fuel and vehicle taxes, provided about 64 percent of the total receipts for highways by all units of government in 1978, while capital outlay accounted for about 44 percent of the expenditures. About \$35 billion were collected, 5.8 percent more than in 1977. Over half the total receipts came from State-level sources. Approximately \$32.5 billion was disbursed for highways, almost 9 percent more than in 1977. The Federal-aid highway construction cost index, now over 2 1/2 times its 1967 base, rose 48.5 points, or 22.4 percent, from 1977 to 1978. The highway maintenance and operation index, now approximately double (218.8 and 195.3, respectively) their 1967 bases, both increased almost 8 percent from 1977 to 1978.

At the State level, highway-user imposts contributed over half the total of State highway funds, and over a quarter of the total came from Federal agencies (such as FHWA). Forty-six percent of the disbursements were for construction projects, another 30.9 percent for maintenance and administration, and 15.2 percent went to county and local governments.

ROADWAY MILEAGE

Roads and streets in the United States, as of December 31, 1978, totaled approximately 3.88 million miles, a 0.5 percent increase from the 1977 figure. Over the past 50 years, mileage in the United States has increased approximately 623,000 miles, an annual increase of 0.4 percent.

VEHICLE MILES

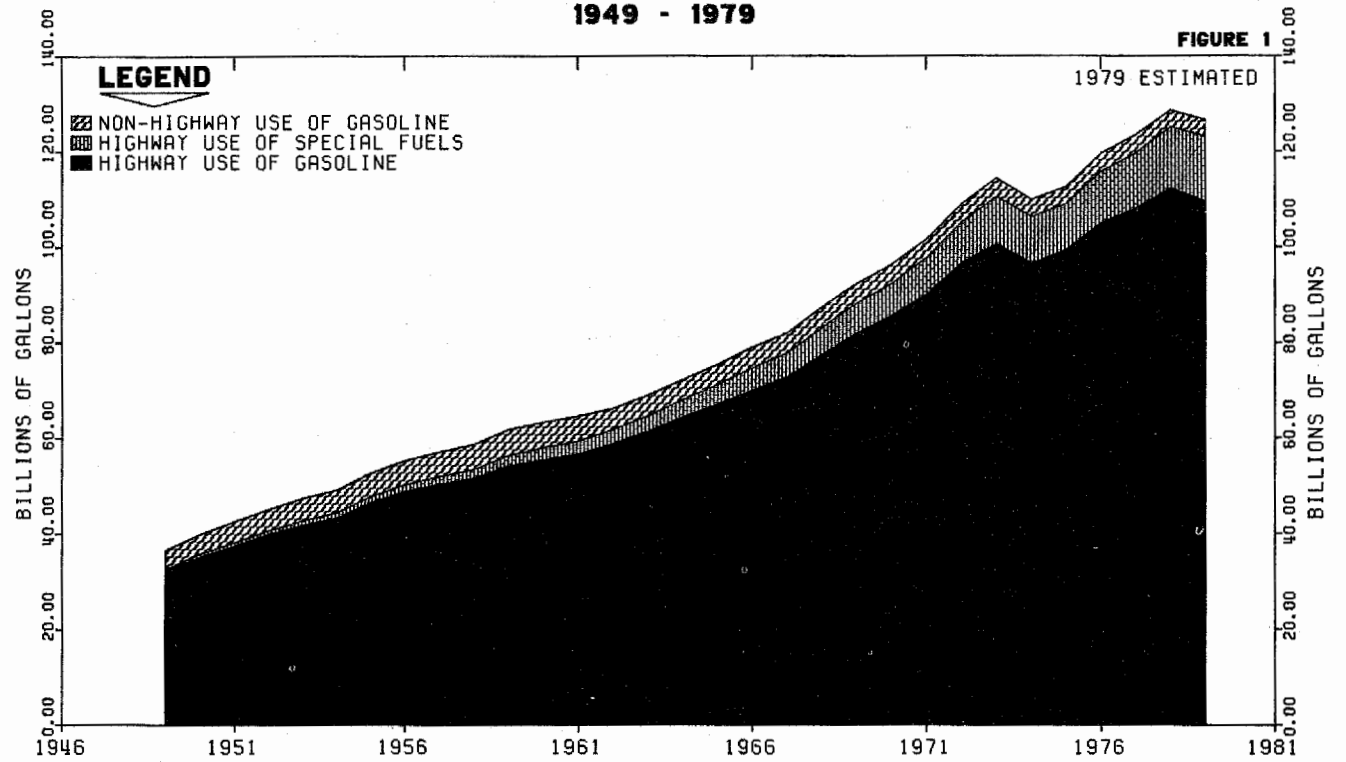
Highway travel in the United States is estimated to have topped 1,548 billion vehicle miles in 1978--an increase of 5 percent over the previous year.

The Federal-Aid Interstate System accounts for about 1 percent of the Nation's total route mileage and carries 19 percent of the travel. The arterial class highways (including Interstate) represent 10 percent of the mileage and carry 67 percent of the travel. All arterial and collector highways combined, which include 30 percent of the Nation's mileage, carry 83 percent of the travel.

MISCELLANEOUS

Expenditures per mile average \$13,599 and \$4,488 per mile for capital outlay and maintenance respectively, compared to \$9.26 per 1,000-vehicle-miles of travel and \$96.33 per registered vehicle. Some of the variations among States may be easier to visualize by considering total road and street miles per 1,000 persons, with the most populous States having less than 20 miles per 1,000 and most of the less populous western States exceeding 60 miles per 1,000 persons.

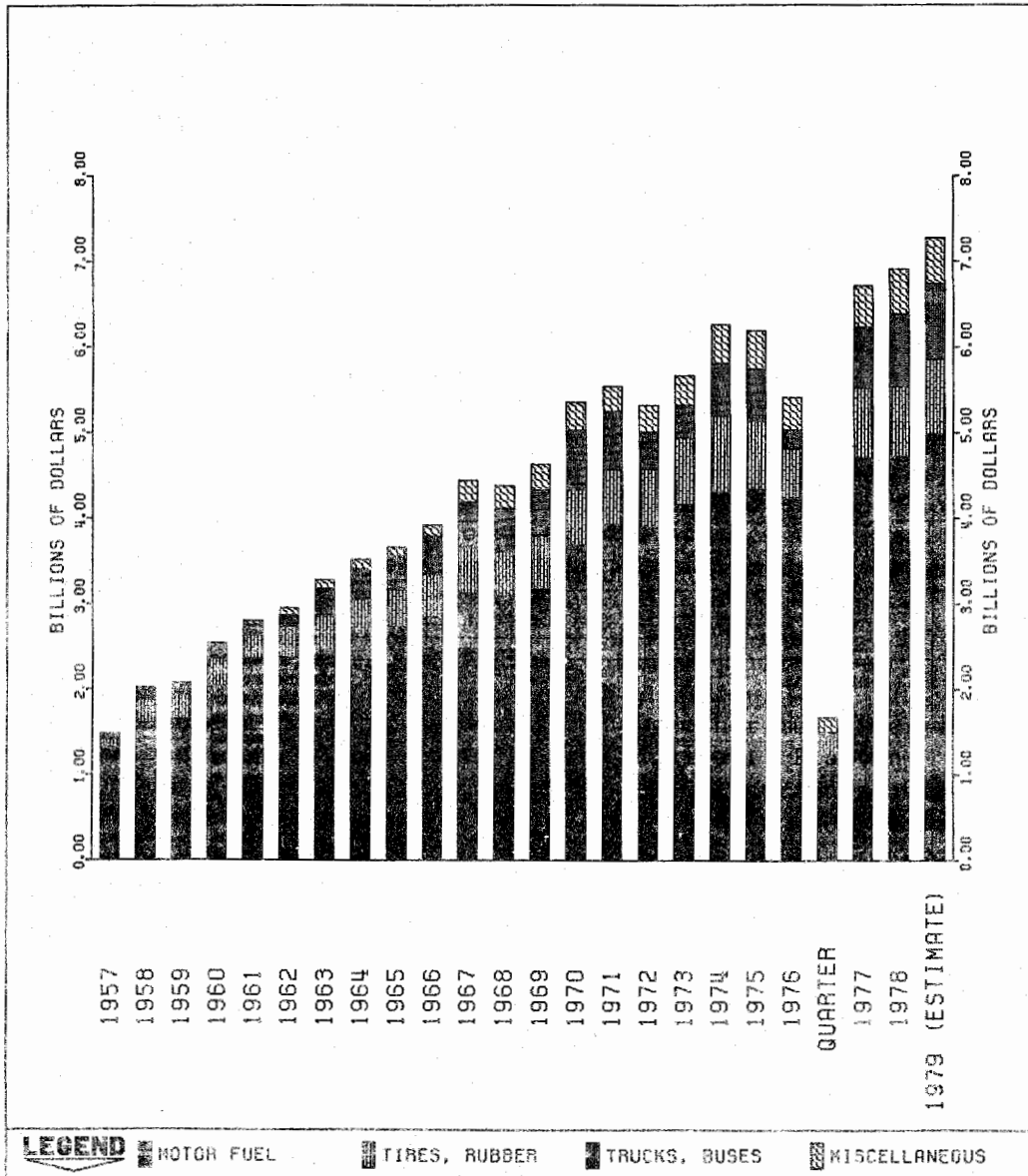

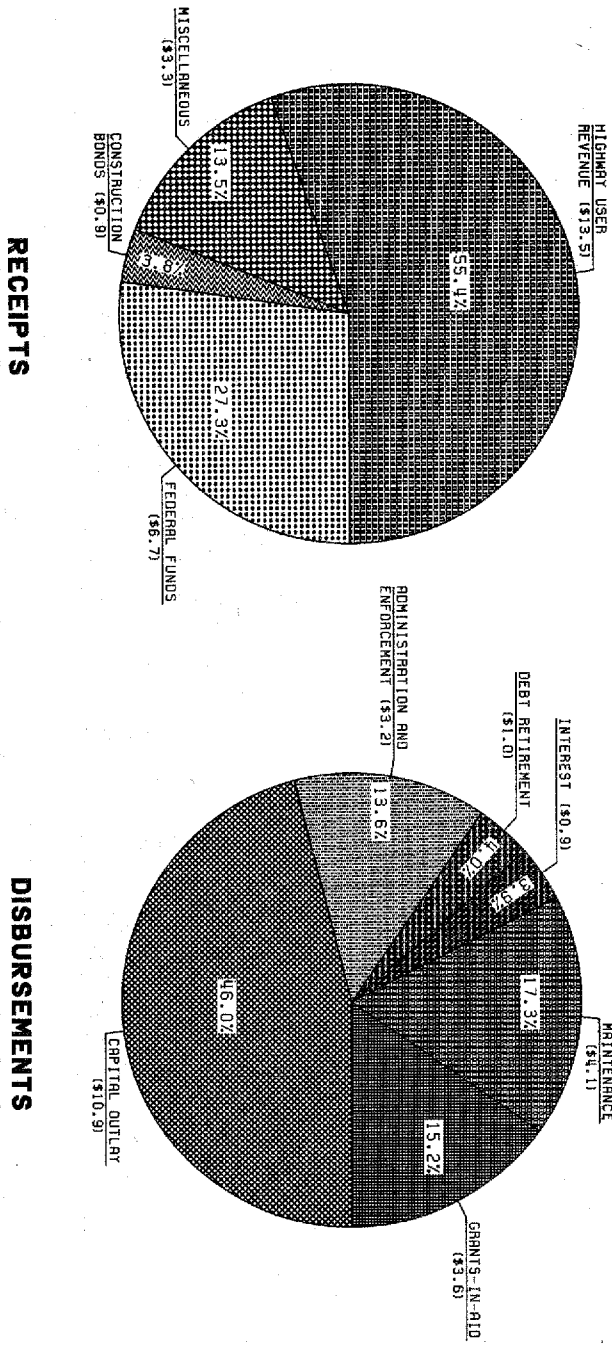

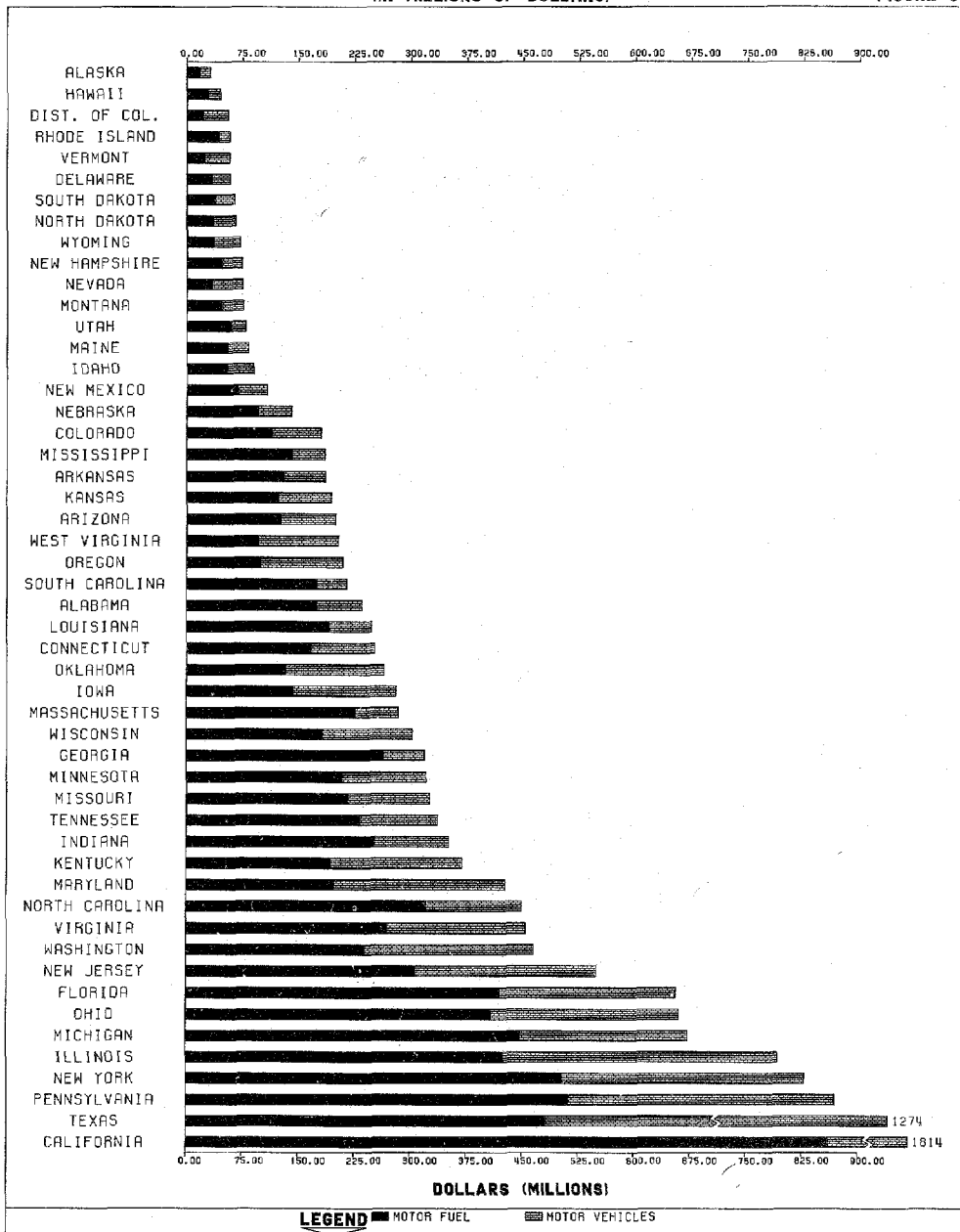

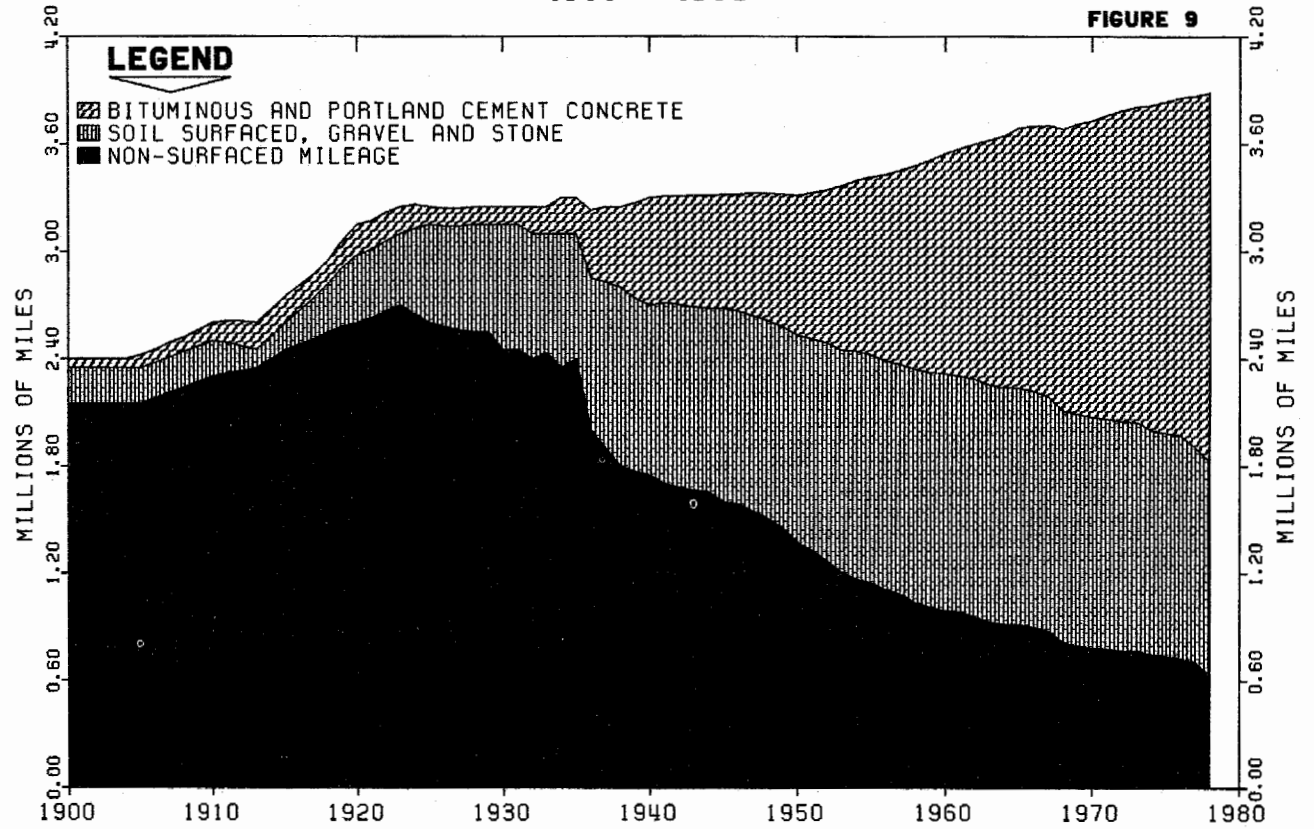

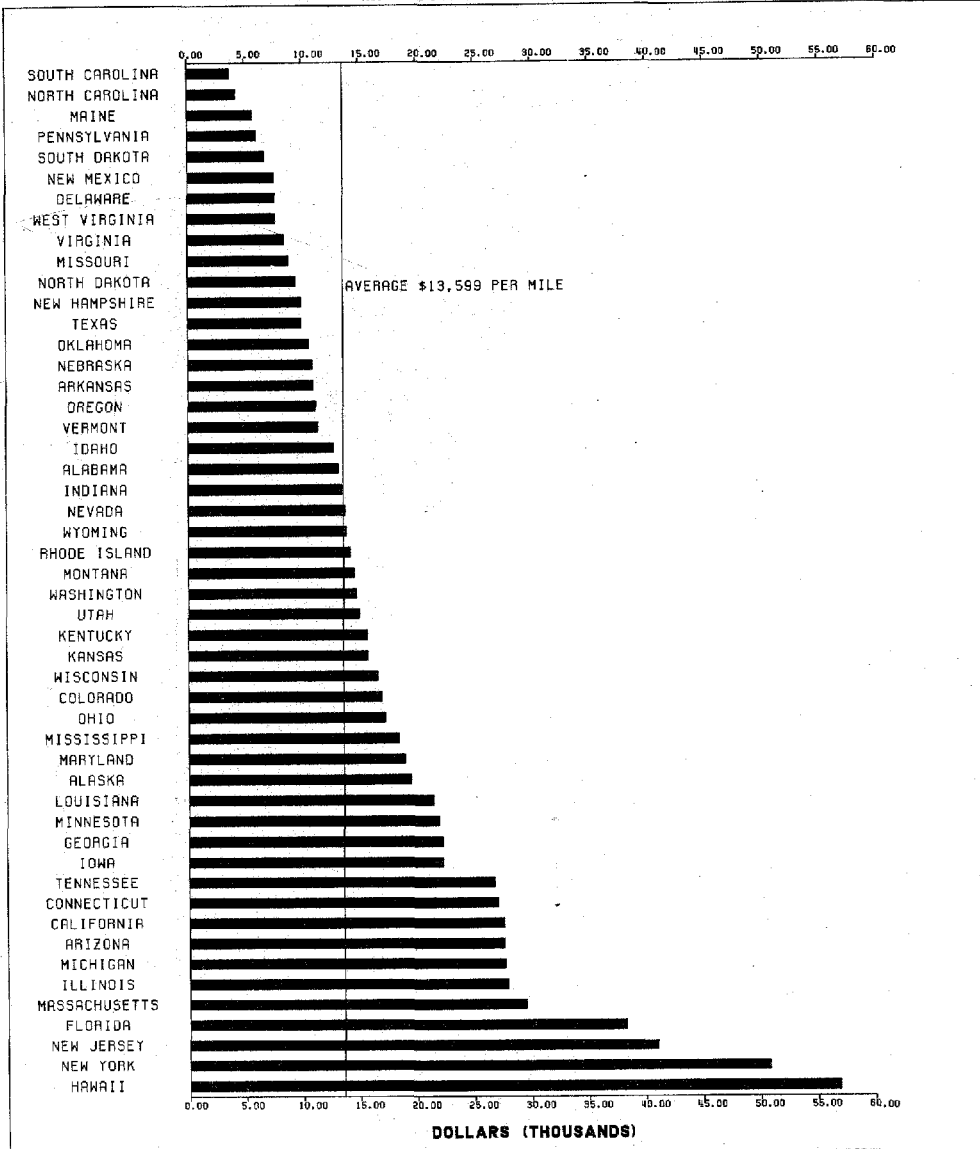

(IN THOUSANDS OF DOLLARS)**

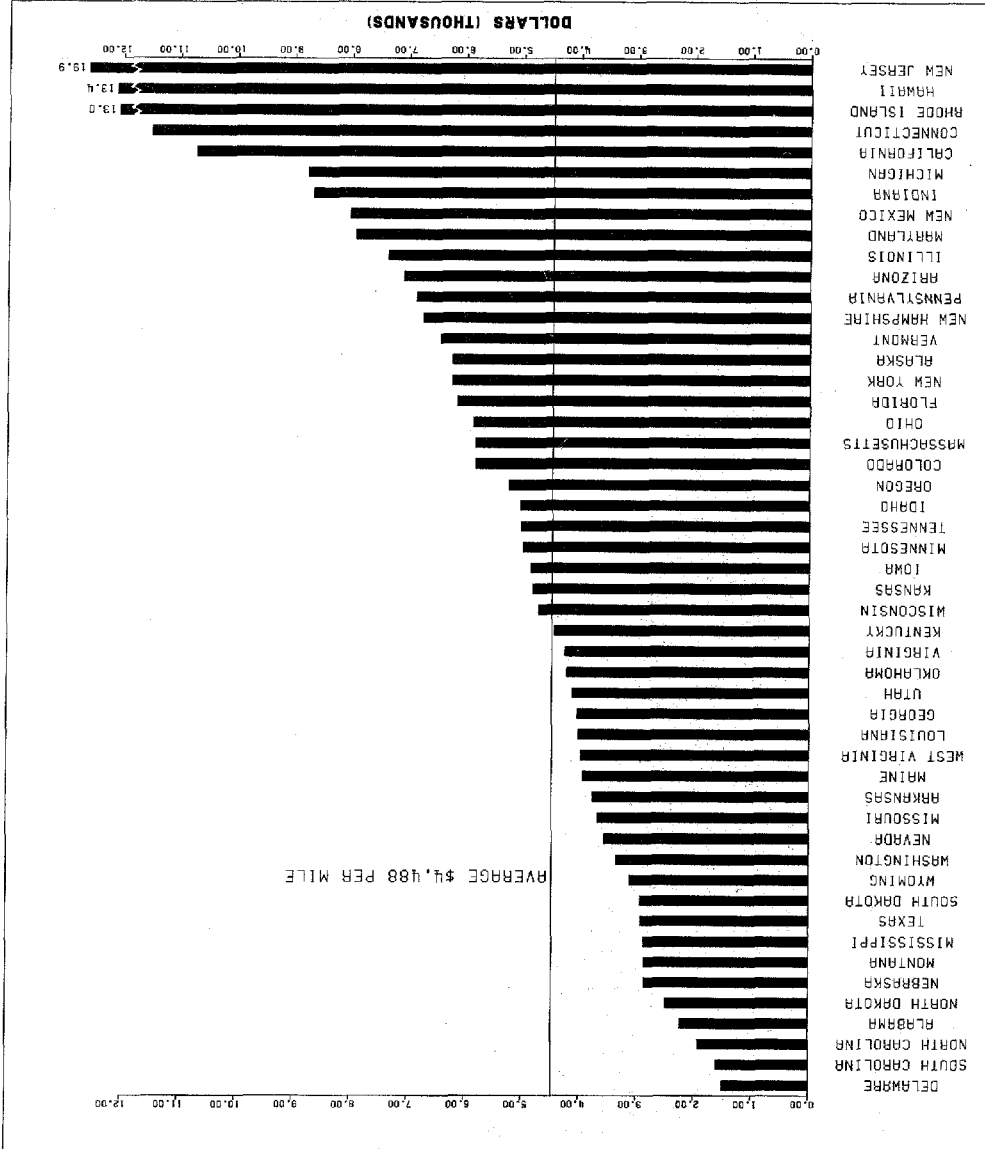
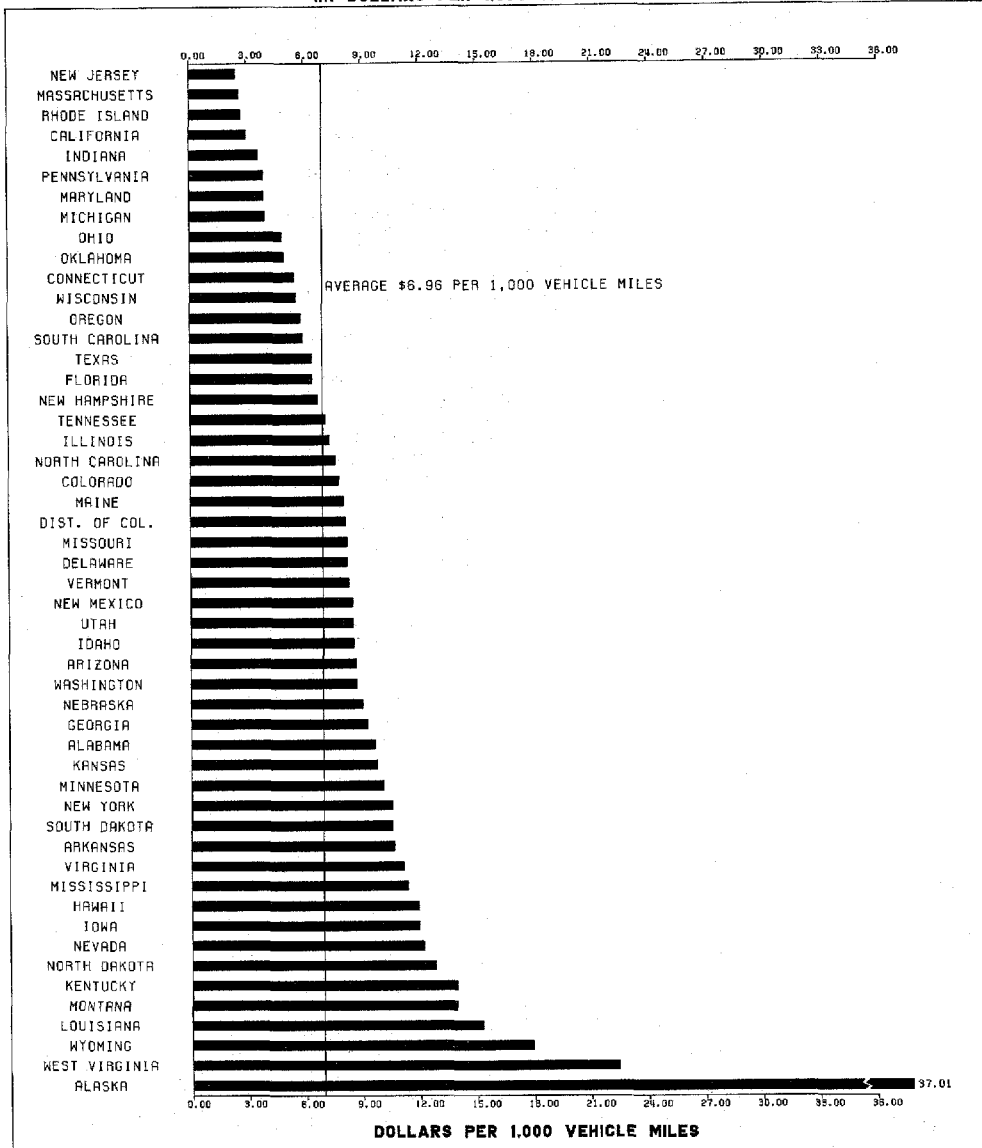

FOR CAPITAL OUTLAY ON ROADS AND STREETS

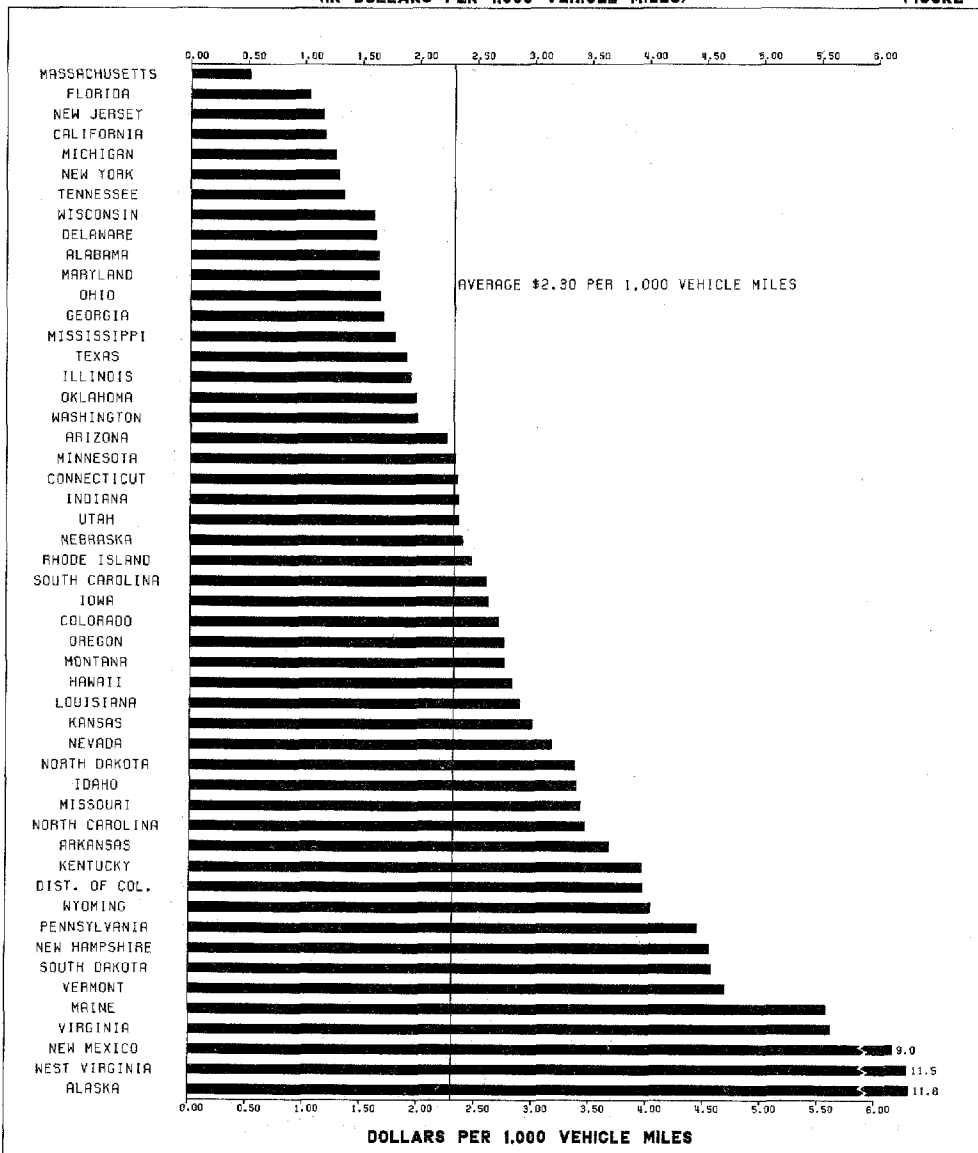

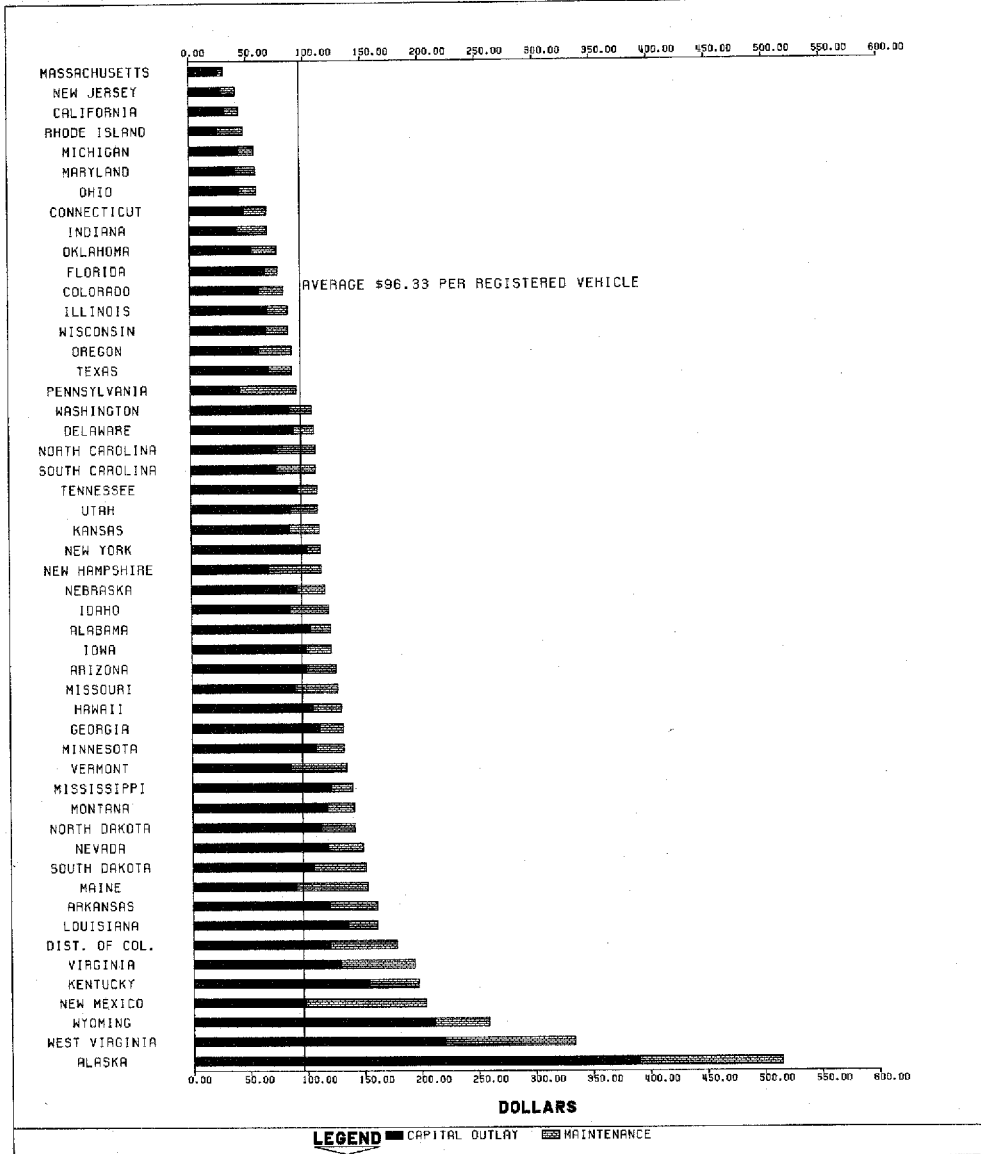


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
